

Stanton Harcourt School received £18,700 in Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) funding for the academic year 2014-15. This funding is provided by the Education Funding Agency (EFA) in addition to the school's core funding and is used to improve the progress, development and outcomes of pupils identified as Pupil Premium pupils. In 2014-15, the school had 15 such pupils, representing 13% of the roll, compared with a national average that year of 16.3%. The school now has an inclusion governor who works with the school leadership to support and monitor provision.

<b>Expenditure summary</b>	<b>Estimated cost (£)</b>
<b>Teaching assistant time and associated resources</b> PPG children are included in small groups to support their learning and help overcome barriers to learning. Of the 211.5 Teaching Assistant hours on the weekly school timetable, approximately 10% of these are directed towards named PPG children. Some of this time is used to support improvement in reading through the purchase and delivery of the reading intervention Project X Code, and costs include materials	15,724
<b>Full curriculum access</b> PPG children are supported to take part in clubs, out of school visits and curriculum trips Educational Psychologist time, some of which has been allocated this year to PPG pupils	1,976
<b>Attendance</b> Time is allocated by office and senior staff to monitor attendance and follow up where required. Attendance data over the course of 2014-15 shows that attendance for the whole school was 93.95% and for PPG children was 90.35%. One main aim of the year 2015-16 will be to reduce this gap.	1,000
